Proposed actions

What is Pupil Premium?

The Pupil Premium was introduced in April 2011 and is allocated to schools to work with pupils who have been registered for free school meals at any point in the last six years (known as 'Ever 6 FSM').

Schools also receive funding for children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months, and children of service personnel.

Why has it been introduced?

The Government believes that the Pupil Premium, which is additional to main school funding, is the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between children eligible for free school meals (FSM) and their peers by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most.

Rationale behind 19-20 objectives

The school has evaluated the toolkit for teaching and learning provided by DFE to enable schools to make the most effective use of this funding and address barriers of social and emotional challenges; early development delays; delays in basic skills, including speech, reading, writing and numeracy. - Behaviour intervention
- Early years intervention
- Metacognition (including feedback)
- Collaboration
- Oral Language intervention
- Social and emotional learning
