Welcome

Welcome to year 2! I hope you have had a fantastic summer and are looking forward to the new school year.

Reading books

Whilst your child is in Year Two they will be responsible for changing their own reading book. The book mark system that you are familiar with will continue, so please ensure that you read with your child as often as possible so that they can swap their book regularly. A record will be kept of how often your child changes their book and the children will be reminded at the end of each week and asked to change if they have not done so already. As their books get longer we will allow more time for the children to enjoy their book at home.

Homework/spellings

Spellings will be sent home each week on a Friday. You should help your child to learn their spelling words in preparation for the following Friday, when there will be a short, informal spelling test. This will commence from Friday 12 September. You will be informed of your child's progress in their spelling test in their spelling record book which must be returned to school each week.

Please keep your eyes peeled for any additional homework linked to topic work or additional studies in literacy or numeracy. The purpose of whole-class homework in Year Two will always be to support the ongoing learning. This might be a written piece of work, additional maths activities, online games or a discussion or a research topic. The children will be informed when a new homework is set and a letter will be sent home to inform parents. Further study outside the classroom is of huge benefit to classroom studies and I appreciate any additional time spent supporting your child in this area.
