SATS

As the term progresses, I will begin to mention SATs more often to the children as we will complete practise tests and activities more. By doing this, we will focus on the skills and techniques required to succeed in these tests.

Homework

This half term, I will continue to give out homework most weeks on Fridays, unless another day is more suitable. As mentioned in the previous letter, I have been impressed with the pride taken by many children in their homework.

Spelling lists will be given out when applicable.

<u>Reading</u>

Please continue to hear you child read as much as possible. Encourage them to discuss their thoughts and opinions as well as summarising the text. As of last term, the children may change their books when needed. Thank you for your continued support in this.

Year 6 timetable
