Reporting to Parents

A written report, on individual pupil's progress, will be sent to parents on an annual basis. This report includes progress on all core and foundation subjects and an overview of performance. Parents are invited to discuss the report with the child's teacher.

Additionally, all the children at the end of Key Stage Two (Year 6) undertake the National Tests as defined by Central Government. Parents are given a written report containing their child's results.

Pastoral Care

The day-to-day welfare of the children is undertaken by the class teacher in conjunction with parents. Ongoing concerns are referred to the Head Teacher. If there are any medical, social or emotional problems you wish to discuss with School please do not hesitate to contact either the class teacher or Head Teacher.

Family events

Throughout the year you will be invited to join the school for celebrations and informal productions.

Complaints Procedure

Parents who do not believe that the curriculum is being delivered properly should, in the first instance, contact the Head Teacher. More formal procedures can be invoked by contacting the Chair of Governors if informal discussions do not resolve the matter.
