## Question 6:

Is there anything that you would like to see included in the SRE Policy that is currently omitted? Response 1: Like religious studies where the difference in the way of life in different religions (burial, marriage, etc) is taught nicely, I propose the relationships differences in different communities must be included. This could be one key-point only, highlighting differences and may be not naming or pointing any community but teaching primary school kids that difference of opinion exists and should be respected. This is taught throughout the whole Jigsaw PSHE / RSE programme – respect for all communities and religions. Response 2: A couple can be same sex It is important to understand that any reference to adult relationships, whether LGBTQ or heterosexual people is NOT describing sexual activity as this would be inappropriate. Relationships lessons focus on respect and regard between people e.g., friendships and families. Response 5:

I am not sure how much teaching there is about same sex relationships, children who are conceived through donor IVF and so do not know their dads, transsexuals and people identifying as different genders. I think it is really important to develop understanding young and so that there is

less misunderstanding and distrust. Thank you for the opportunity to consult on this matter and for taking the views of parents on board.

There are a variety of family situations in British Society and all children and families should not be made to feel less accepted. This is taught throughout the Jigsaw PSHE program at Welton. IVF is addressed within the Year 5 changing me puzzle piece when the children learn about conception. This puzzle piece helps them understand that sometimes people need IVF to help them have a baby.

Response 6:

No questions just very positive feedback on the programme and thanks to the school for setting up the session as it helped our understanding of what our children will be taught and how.

#### Questions that arose from the consultation meeting

Question 1:

Is it possible to be made aware when these sessions are delivered so that we can check in with our child at home to see if they have any further questions.

The school will hold short, year group meetings, delivered by SLT and class teachers to share the exact materials used in school prior to the Jigsaw puzzle piece 'Changing me' is delivered in the summer term.

Question 2:

The context can be the same. My question is, is it possible that Muslim children could be taught the subject separately by a Muslim teacher?

The school will hold further discussion with a member of the local Muslim community in regards this point.

Question 3:

Who will be delivering the RSE sessions, the Class Teacher or another member of staff? All RSE lessons will be taught by a fully qualified teacher, and preferably the class teacher.
