Village	Town	City
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Small settlement that may have houses, a primary school, a few shops, a Post Office, a church and a village hall. They are usually found in a rural area.

Larger than a village with lots of houses. May have a railway station or a shopping centre. They may have a weekly market and have a town council. A large settlement with lots of building and lots of people. It will have hospitals, sports facilities, universities, shops, offices and many houses.
