What should I already know?

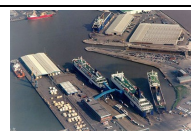
- Have an understanding of the geography of their school. (Y1)

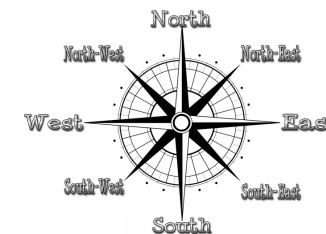

Human	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There are some houses and flats in the centre of Hull that are lived in by people who work in the city. • There is one main road out of Hull: Clive Sullivan Way. • There are lots of interesting buildings including The Deep, KC Stadium, Holy Trinity Church and the Humber Bridge. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There are many houses in Kimberley that are homes to the people who work in the mine and other industries. • Railway that connects directly connects Kimberley with the capital city of Cape Town. • There are many important museums and visitor attractions including the McGregor Museum, Pioneers of Aviation Museum and The Big Hole Museum.
Physical	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two major rivers, the Hull and the Humber that lead to the North Sea. • Lots of fish in the seas close to Hull. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Kamfers Dam—large area of water that is home to wildlife. • Diamonds found in the ground in the local area.

- A continent is a massive area of land that is separated from other areas of land by water or natural features.
- Each continent has a wide range of land types, climates and animal life.
- The surface of the planet is mostly covered in water.
- It contains 5 oceans: The Arctic, Atlantic, Indian, Pacific and Southern Oceans.
- All of the oceans are connected together.



- A **compass** is a tool for finding direction.
- A simple **compass** has a magnetic needle mounted on a short pin.
- The needle, which can spin freely, always points north.
