

Hair - this grows on our head and helps to protect our skull. The skull is the bone that protects our brain.

Eyebrows - these protect our eyes.

Eyes - these help us to see.

Ears - these help us to hear.

Nose - this helps us to smell.

Mouth - this allows us to eat and talk. Inside our mouth is a tongue which helps us taste and teeth, we use to chew our food.

Neck - this connects the head to the rest of the body.

Shoulders - these allow our arms to lift up.

Elbows - these let our arms bend.

Hands - these help us grab things and write.

Stomach - this part of our body is where we digest our food.

Feet - these help us stay balanced and upright.

Knees - these let us bend our legs.
