## PSHE Puzzle Piece Vocabulary

<b>Artefacts</b>	An object made by a human being, typically one of cultural or historical interest
<b>Bullying</b>	To cause (someone) to do something by means of force.
<b>Celebration</b>	To celebrate an important day or event
<b>Colour</b>	Pigmentation of the skin, especially as an indication of someone's ethnicity
<b>Conflict</b>	A disagreement or argument,
<b>Culture</b>	The ideas, customs, and social behaviour of a particular people or society
<b>Cyber Bullying</b>	Bullying that is done by posting hurtful electronic messages on the internet.
<b>Difference</b>	Being different from or not like.
<b>Direct</b>	To aim what one says or writes towards a particular person or group
<b>Discrimination</b>	The act of treating some people unfairly because of prejudice.
<b>Developing World</b>	A poor agricultural country that is seeking to become more advanced economically and socially.
<b>Happiness</b>	An emotional state characterized by feelings of joy, satisfaction, contentment, and fulfilment.
<b>Homophobic</b>	An extreme fear or hatred of homosexuals or homosexuality.
<b>Indirect</b>	Not direct; avoiding stating the truth
<b>Name Calling</b>	Offensive, abusive language, or insults.
<b>Race</b>	A human population sharing common physical characteristics that have been passed down from one generation to the next.
<b>Racism</b>	Unfair treatment of people based on the opinion that one race is better than another.
<b>Rumour</b>	a piece of information passed from one person to another without any proof that it is true
<b>Texting</b>	Sending a short message typed on a cell phone and sent to another cell phone
