


Phonics and Reading

Encourage your child to enjoy books

Alternatively, try reading fiction and non fiction books on the theme of Under the sea.



Find some books about Pirates. Can the children predict what the story might be about? When you have finished reading it together ask the children to retell the main events in the correct order.



Look for words in the books you read that are plural. Can the children spot 's' and 'es' endings?

Mark Making

Try writing simple sentences or stories.

These could be about sea creatures or pirates. Words should be spelt using the sounds the children know, correct spelling for words other than the known tricky words, is not essential.

Can the children use describing words in their sentences?

Eg The fish was big and spaghkkee.

One day the grait wight shark swam to a shipwreck.

Children can attempt to write their surname using Welton handwriting

Understanding the World

Research information about sea creatures they are interested in. Use books or the internet. Children can decide how to record the information they find. Can they teach someone in their family the facts that they found out?



Visit the beach to look for objects washed up from the sea. Where did they come from? How did they get there? Can children explain their ideas?



Create a pirate themed role play area or build a pirate kingdom!

What would it need? Can the children create stories about the pirates and act them out?

Other Ideas

Try making some biscuits or create a salad on the theme of the sea!



The children could create their own boats using objects they find around the house. They can test them to see if they float. How much weight can they carry before they sink?
