



WHAT IS 'PE AND SPORT PREMIUM' FUNDING?

Primary PE and Sport Premium is an initiative that aims to help increase and improve the PE and sporting opportunities for children. It was first provided in the 2013/14 academic year and the current government has pledged to continue this funding until 2020.

PE and Sport Premium funding is provided jointly by the Department for Education, the Department for Health and Culture and the Department for Media and Sport. It has been allocated to primary school Head Teachers' and is ring-fenced, meaning that it can only be spent on the provision of PE and sport in schools.

The Government believes that Head Teachers' and school leaders should decide how to use the funding for PE and Sports in school.

Welton Primary School funding for the academic year is £19,540.

School objective: To improve the quality of behaviour within school by promoting good sportsmanship, team ethos and leadership skills in the older pupils.
