The Spring Term was a busy one for staff, children and therefore parents. It has also been a term for celebration with the school's hard work being celebrated in league tables and Local Authority categorisation.

As you may be aware Mrs Leighton is leaving Welton Primary School at the end of this term. In fact she will be reducing her working week to three days from the start of the summer term. We are very sad to have to say goodbye to Mrs Leighton but we are very hopeful she will continue to be involved with the school in the future. For now, we continue to benefit from her dedication and enthusiasm for the community of Welton School.

The Governors are very pleased to be able to inform you that they have successfully recruited a new Deputy Head Teacher who will join Welton in September 2019. We look forward to welcoming Mrs Milica Saleh to the Welton family.

Mathematics and school improvement

As you know the school's priority for improvement this year is mathematics The staff have delivered and participated in over 40 hours of training and are rigorously focussing on pupil outcomes and progress. In addition to this:

• We have worked with two external maths consultants to build capabilities in all teaching and support staff. There have been two Numicon training days where the importance of conceptual understanding was emphasised across the different key stages and teachers have worked on focused planning with an external consultant.

• Two members of staff have participated in the sustaining mastery maths TRG hub groups and have hosted a session on variation and intelligent practice.

• A member of the middle leadership team is participating in the EEF 5 day maths course designed to improve mathematical outcomes in Key Stage 2 and 3 and is a research based project which centres around 5 target areas in maths. The same leader is participating in the 5 mastery maths lead course and is developing maths questioning and dialogue and this complements work in school around metacognition and Blooms Taxonomy.

• A Foundation Hub has been launched by the Outwood Academy and our Foundation Stage Lead has joined this with a focus on number and cardinality.

Impact

We were very proud after hosting a numicon advocate day to receive this email from the consultant: A belated thank you on behalf of OUP for a fabulous open morning last week, could you please also pass on our thanks to Mrs Harding for guiding us brilliantly around your wonderful school. I can honestly say that Mrs Harding showcased your school brilliantly, teachers were genuinely blown away by the teaching and learning in each classroom and were totally impressed to see Numicon being used in upper KS2 to solve complex fractions. It was a joy to meet your children - one little boy in Y5 told me that apart from his lunch Maths was his favourite subject! Children clearly enjoy Maths because they understand it ... I cannot praise you highly enough. Teachers took copious notes, photographs and left feeling inspired.

Tour de Yorkshire

Welton School are looking forward to contributing to the Land Art Installation on Dale Road. This is an exciting, collaborative schools project and will comprise of all children in our school making a personalised flag to form a part of the bike shape that will be featured on the field. We are certain that this will make an eye catching view from land and air and we are delighted to be collaborating with our partnership schools on this. In addition to this, there will be an opportunity for any interested pupils to help create an artistic installation for the cyclists and their supporters to see as they cycle past Welton church. This will be on the theme of our WILS skills, as we believe the cyclists will need these attributes.
